New Business:

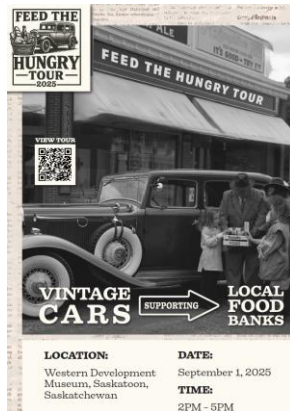

1965 Pontiac Laurentian

- Original paint
- Four door sedan
- 283 Engine
- Power steering
- 3 speed power glide transmission

his 4-door, 1965 Pontiac Laurentian has been in my family since purchased new in Saskatoon from Mid City Motors. It has approximately 65,500 original miles, much of which was driven at 50 MPH by our mother on gravel roads during her time teaching in Saskatchewan rural schools in the 1960s and 1970s. The car was stored in a single car garage from about 1974 to 2014.

Mechanical work was completed from 2019 – 2022 to put it back on the road:

- Replaced all belts and hoses
- Re-cored the radiator which preserved original tanks and transmission lines
- New gas tank
- New gas gauge sender
- New fuel pump
- Remanufactured carburetor
- Brakes done as required
- Complete ignition tune-up with new parts
- New tires

Issues

- Right rear bumper was pushed into rear fender many years ago. Bumper was straightened but no bodywork or paint attempted.
- Needs interior rear window molding.
- Needs interior upholstery attended to
- Reconditioned push button Pontiac radio is included. Car has antenna but no speaker. Needs to be installed.



Questions/Comments/Concerns:

Club member Randy Stene is home from hospital and is still recovering and taking treatment. He will need to take it easy for a while yet. It was good to see Randy and Irene in attendance at the meeting tonight.

John and Sue Giesy are in the US right now, and John is interested in buying and importing a vehicle from the US to Canada. A question was asked to members if they had any recent experience with customs, duties, and current tariffs. Al W had some limited information that he researched: 25% tariff applies to vehicles that are not CUSMA compliant. That is, vehicles built with 75 to 80 % North American components are supposed to be tariff exempt. Classic Vehicles (older than 25 years) are supposed to be tariff exempt. (However, there was information found later that the classic vehicle MUST also be built with 75 to 80% North American components.

Mike Van Grondelle added to the conversation certain dates that changes took place in the import policies and legislation. He also had some information from NAACC. Many things are unclear and uncertain as new changes are constantly evolving from the Canadian and US governments.

Paul Collyer echoed much of the same information and also offered some comments as to what he had experienced. Importing vehicles from the USA into Canada as mentioned by Sue Giesy.
