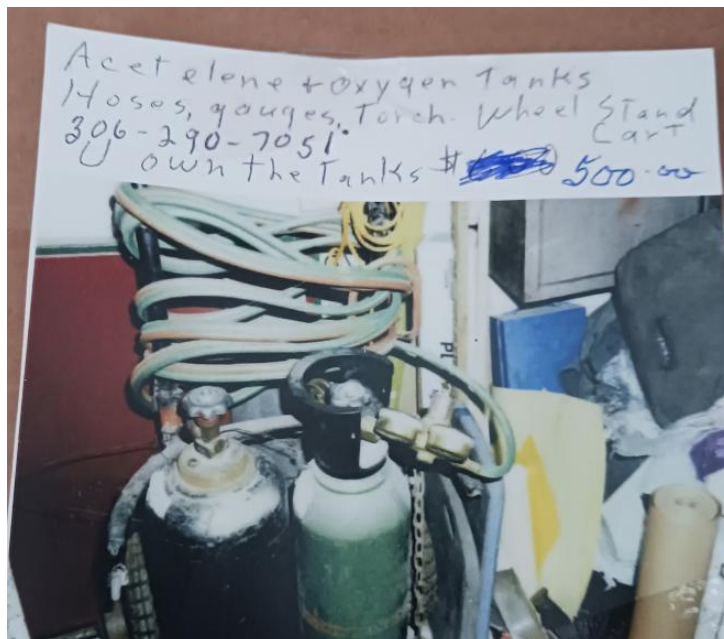

- A. For Sale 1955 Chevy Step Side Truck. This was a complete ground up restoration of a period correct 1955 truck. The engine was rebuilt by Zaran's Cylinder Head Service in Regina. The assembly was completed by Don Kincaid of the Avonlee area. This is not your 70 MPH modern truck, this is your 3 speed (on the tree) manual transmission, strait 6 cylinder with an oil bath air cleaner. Its a great example of the 1955 era farm work truck. The key is a straight 2 position (on/off) with a pedal next to the gas pedal that activates the starter, a manual choke on a cable will help with cold starts. Asking Price is \$25,000.00





- B. For Sale 1962 Cadillac Fleetwood 4 Door Hardtop. Exterior is white interior is a beige to light brown. This vehicle starts and runs great smooth idle and expansive seating capacity.
